

TRY IT AT HOME

Make Your Own Guitar!

Materials:

- 1 small cereal box
- 1 wrapping paper tube
- 1 Ruler
- String
- Scissors
- Glue
- Tape
- Ribbon or rope



Directions:

- 1. Have an adult help you glue the cereal box closed at both ends, and cut a circle out on each end for the tube to go through.
- 2. Ask your adult to cut a circle out of the front of the box and use a ruler to create five to six smaller holes at the top and bottom of the same side.
- 3. Thread your string though each pair of holes to create six guitar strings!
- 4. Insert your tube into the box, leaving a little bit showing. Tape it down and tie a ribbon around both ends to create a strap if you like!
