TRY IT AT HOME!

The Basics of Beatboxing

Step One: Watch this video about basic beatboxing sounds! https://www.cbc.ca/kidscbc2/the-feed/learn-how-to-beatbox

Step Two:

Review the different sounds that KRNFX makes in the video:

For the bass drum, KRNFX says that you should think of the letter B, without vocalizing it, while pushing the air out of your mouth. This sound will need to be as tight and as crisp as possible.



The second sound, the high hat, think of the letter T and S together and push the air out of your mouth tapping your tongue against your teeth.

Finally, for the K snare, you will need to relax your mouth and suck the air in so it sounds like the letter K.

Step Three: Make your own beat and experiment! It's okay if you don't get it right, practice makes perfect!

We encourage you share your experience with us today through a photo or post on social media during or after the program. If you'll be using your phone, do it with consideration for those around you and on stage, and remember that recording the full program is not permitted.
