TRY IT AT HOME!

How do planets orbit the Sun?

Materials:

-Orange Playdough -Blue Ball -Pie Tin

Instructions:

1. Flatten the orange playdough (the Sun) in the center of the pie tin.

2. Place the blue ball (the planet) in the pie tin

3. Try and tilt the pie tin so that the planet orbits around the sun!
